### REGULATIONS

***There are no entry fees***

1 Schedules and entry forms in hard copy may be obtained from 6 Carclew Tce, Devoran, Cartref, Point Green, 5 St John's Tce, Devoran, Feock Parish Office, Playing Place Post Office.

Completed entry forms must be delivered or sent by Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> March to 22 Market St., Devoran., or 6 Carclew Terrace, Devoran, or via email [devoranflowershow2018@gmail.com](mailto:devoranflowershow2018@gmail.com).

2 Exhibitors may stage up to two exhibits in each class except those in Section VI (Photo) where only 1 exhibit is allowed in each class. Judges will be at liberty to withdraw prizes where the exhibits are deficient in merit and to award special prizes to exhibits worthy of them. The judge's decision will be final. Exhibitors are requested to name their exhibits if possible.

3 Exhibits in section I must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for at least two months prior to the show. Cards corresponding to the class, section and exhibitor's number will be provided. Vases are provided for staging flower exhibits.

### EXHIBITS EXCEEDING SPECIFIED SIZE MAY NOT BE JUDGED.

4 Exhibitors in section IV (Cookery) to show their exhibits on their own

plates, covered in cling film, to remove them at the end of the show. Exhibits in section V (Handicrafts) should have been completed in the previous 12 months.

5 Prize giving will commence at approximately 3.45pm. Nothing may be removed before 4.30pm. Every care is taken for the protection of all exhibits but the committee will not be held responsible for any damage.

6 After judging is completed, exhibitors may offer any of their exhibits for sale. These should be clearly marked with a price and a means of contact. Transactions are the responsibility of the exhibitor. The committee will not act as agents. The rule on removal of exhibits will still apply (not before 4.30pm).

7 The hall will be open for the staging of exhibits from 8.30am until 10.30am. It will then be closed for the judging of exhibits. Exhibits must be staged and the hall cleared by 10.30am. The hall will re-open at 2.00pm.

8 Admission to the show will be by silver donation.

9 Cups will be awarded for:

The most points in each section (section I has two cups - flowers (1-28) & daffodils (29-37)).

The most points in Preserves classes.

The best exhibit in Class 38 (pre-school).

The best exhibit in section I (excluding daffodils).

The most points by a child (16 and under) in Section IV (cooking) and in section VI (Photo).

The most points in the childrens' classes in Section VI (photo).

Points awarded will be 10 for first place, 6 for second and 2 for third place.

Children are encouraged to enter adult classes but please state age on entry form.

10 No prize money for adult classes, but children's classes will receive prize money:

1<sup>st</sup> prize £1.00    2<sup>nd</sup> prize 60p    3<sup>rd</sup> prize 20p

Prize money not collected by 4.45pm will be returned to the Show funds.

- 5 Bloom or blooms from an outdoor flowering plant excluding specimens covered in other classes.
- 6 Specimen indoor foliage plant.
- 7 Specimen indoor flowering plant, in flower, excluding those in classes 8-10.
- 8 1 Pot Cyclamen.
- 9 Fern in pot, any variety.
- 10 Geranium or Pelargonium Plant.
- 11 Single Cactus plant.
- 12 Single succulent.
- 13 Flowering bulb in pot not exceeding 23cm, excluding Amaryllis.
- 14 1 Pot of flowering miniature, e.g. African Violet, Cyclamen, Roses or other.
- 15 Primrose, 1 plant in pot not exceeding 15.cm.
- 16 Polyanthus, 1 plant in pot not exceeding 23cm
- 17 1 Vase of 3 Tulips, mixed colours permitted.
- 18 Group of unforced spring flowers, 3 varieties, 3 vases, not hardwood.
- 19 1 Vase of scented spring flowers. To be judged on scent.
- 20 Iris, 1 vase, 3 spikes, mixed colours permitted.
- 21 1 Vase of Anemones, single or double, 6 stems.
- 22 Hellebores, 6 heads, in a shallow bowl of water not exceeding 20cm diam.
- 23 Polyanthus blooms, 6 stems with own foliage. Mixed colours permitted.
- 24 Muscari, 6 blooms.
- 25 Camellia, 1 bloom SINGLE, i.e. one row of not more than 8 overlapping petals with central group of conspicuous stamens.
- 26 Camellia, 1 bloom SEMI-DOUBLE, i.e. more than 8 petals with a conspicuous stamen.
- 27 Camellia, 1 bloom DOUBLE, i.e. blooms not covered by the above.
- 28 Camellia, 3 blooms, mixed colours and types permitted.
- 29 1 Vase of 1 long trumpet bloom Daffodil or Narcissi.
- 30 1 Vase of 1 short trumpet bloom Daffodil or Narcissi.

- 31 1 Vase of one bloom Daffodil or Narcissi, with split corona (div 11).
- 32 1 Vase 1 double bloom of Daffodil or Narcissi.
- 33 1 Vase Daffodils or Narcissi, 1 variety, 3 blooms (multi-headed).
- 34 1 Vase Daffodils or Narcissi, 1 variety, 3 blooms (not multi-headed).
- 35 1 Vase Daffodils or Narcissi, 1 variety, 3 blooms (dwarf or miniature).
- 36 3 Vases, 3 varieties Daffodils or Narcissi, 3 blooms of one variety per vase.
- 37 1 Pot of 3 to 5 blooms Daffodil or Narcissi. Growing in a pot not to exceed 18cm.

# RECIPE

## CUT AND COME AGAIN CAKE.

225g oz SR flour

$\frac{1}{4}$  tsp salt

1 tsp mixed spice

110g margarine

110ml of milk or water

110g caster sugar

250g mixed fruit

1 tsp grated lemon or orange rind

1 egg

Rubbing in method

Approx 15cm tin

Bake for approx 80 mins. Gas mark 4 or 360F/175C.
